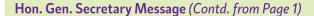

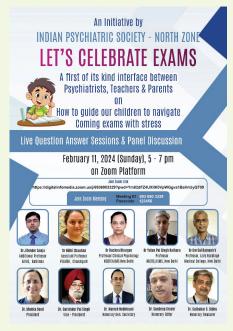

Let's Celebrate Exams

The Indian Psychiatric Society – North Zone set rolling a new initiative titled "LET'S CELEBRATE EXAMS", on February 11, 2024, with an online program featuring teachers and parents of children appearing for Class 9 to Class 12 exams, and a galaxy of mental health professionals. The program saw the participation of over 200 teachers and parents.

A distinguished panel of experts comprising Dr Om Sai Ramesh V, Professor, Lady Hardinge Medical College, New Delhi, Dr Yatan Pal Singh Balhara, Professor, NDDTC, AIIMS, Delhi, Dr Rachna Bhargava, Professor, Clinical Psychology, NDDTC, AIIMS, Delhi, Dr Jitender Aneja, Additional Professor, AIIMS, Bathinda, and Dr Nidhi Chauhan, Assistant Professor, PGIMER, Chandigarh, answered the queries sent by the teachers and the parents, on a wide range of issues related to the stress associated with approaching exams.

One session each, for the parents and the teachers was conducted. The sessions were chaired by senior psychiatrists of the North Zone, including Dr Abdul Maajid, Immediate Past President of the IPS - North Zone, Dr Roop Sidana, IPS NZ representative to the IPS, Dr Sandeep Goyal, past President of the IPS -North Zone, Dr Deepali Gul, Professor at P.I.M.S., Jalandhar (Punjab), and Dr Vinod Kumar Daria, Professor at GMC, Kota (Rajasthan). The program was moderated by Dr Gulbahar Sidhu, Honorary Treasurer, IPS – North Zone.

The event was graced by Dr Savita Malhotra, Honorable Vice-President and President Elect, IPS who emphasized on seeing all exams in the larger context of life and not to pressurize the children to excel in them.

Dr Gurvinder Pal Singh, Vice-President, IPS – North Zone, spoke on the need to have realistic expectations from the children. The Department of Psychiatry, Government Medical College and Hospital, Chandigarh, had organized activities commemorate the Autism World Awareness day 2024. In liaison with the Indian Psychiatric Society -North Zone, there was a discussion panel 'Autism entitled Spectrum Disorder:

Challenges, Responsibilities and Action' which was chaired by Dr Rakesh Chaddha, Ex-HOD, Department of Psychiatry, AIIMS, New Delhi and renowned private psychiatrist Dr Roop Sidana, Ganganagar. The panelists included Dr Priti Arun, Head of Department of Psychiatry, GMCH, Chandigarh, Ms Sangeeta Jain, Executive Director, NGO SOREM, Ms Indu Chaswal, Founder Director, Aaddit Charitable trust, Jalandhar,

and Ms Nidhi Goyal, State Coordinator, Samagra Shiksha, Chandigarh with moderator Dr Shivangi Mehta, Assistant Professor, Department of Psychiatry, GMCH, Chandigarh.

The panel discussion focused on the challenges faced by the parents, the professionals and the teachers while dealing with the children with Autism and it encompassed the journey of two mothers of children with ASD who turned professionals treading the journey of autism over past 2-3 decades. Ms Sangeeta Jain started out seeking professional training and then joined in the NGO SOREM and has even started a respite care for ASD and actively marching ahead in this journey. While, Ms Indu Chaswal had 2 children with ASD with different intellectual levels and needs and subsequently her husband succumbed to cancer, but her progress is relentless. She started her journey at Action for Autism and subsequently founded the Aaddit Charitable trustat Jalandhar and is actively working there. Ms Nidhi Goyal has been working towards helping the parents via Government schemes and their implementation at school levels. Dr Priti Arun shared the challenges of parents from the perspectives of professionals and she emphasized on the shared responsibility.

Meri Beti- a true story

You do not choose your family. They are God's gift to you. This I realize in my new journey of family life in a national importance institution. The value of sons and daughters, wife, parents and colleagues is immense and extended family is a strong supporting bond on this earth. I started traveling on a roadway bus with fast speed in September 2021 to appear in an interview for a professor post. I was reading books as a tough interview was on the next day. I booked a hotel room on the way and suddenly the bus stopped on the highway near my place of interview and we were asked to leave the bus. Slowly I got out of the bus and with difficulty reached the booked hotel. The receptionist refused to allow me the room as the date of booking was wrong. After a lot of requests, they agreed to double the price and allotted me a room on the first floor. In the morning the receptionist refused to add transport services and I travelled on foot to reach the interview place. The interview room was very silent and I was asked very tough questions and I failed miserably in the first attempt. The next day I took help from senior professionals for the interview in year March 2022 who advised me to take notes from a good professional to answer the tough questions. I started searching for it but could not trace it.

During a telepsychiatry duty, I found that one of our brightest



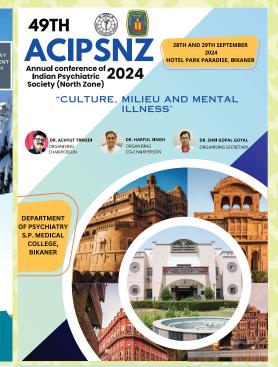
exams appearing post-graduate students was preparing notes. I requested her but initially, she refused. After one week again I requested her and she agreed to it for a few hours. I hurriedly got it photostat from various places and returned her the notes. I was surprised when the student visited my room and humbly requested not to share these notes with any other colleague. I assured her and has a wish ki kaash meri Beti be esihoti. She was very polite and prayed for my selection. Luckily my next attempt at an interview was successful and I received a very good message from her my adopted beti. She received many obstacles during her study career and professional life. Luckily, she also got selected at my place of posting. She used to provide opinion to me like daughter about further progress and crucial decision in career life. She supported me whenever I was in indecisive mode of emotional turmoil. One day there was a surprize inspection in our institution. She being hard worker informed me at 9 PM about surprize inspection by senior authorities and my career was saved by her efforts. Sometimes I got hurt whenever I view tears in eyes and we pray together for passing of tough time in our institution. We both respect each other like messenger of God and try to help the poor patients in one way or other way. Now I realize the value of daughter in each family.
