



### **Dr Rajeev Gupta**

#### A Tribute by one of his students

Teachers impact the lives of their students in ways that go far beyond the confines of academic knowledge. A good teacher engages, encourages, and ensures that the student lives up to his/her capabilities. A good teacher makes the student discover hitherto untapped talents within them. There can be no better example than Dr. Rajeev Gupta, whom we lost two years back.

Being one of his students, the one lesson that he made us learn was to think out of the box. He would always encourage us to consider every patient as a human being who has come to us in distress. We, as postgraduate students, would be obsessed with labelling every patient with an ICD–10diagnosis, as part of our work-ups. Often, the patient's history would just refuse to fit into any diagnostic construct. When we hesitantly shared our problem with Dr Gupta, he, much to our surprise, smiled back and said, "ICD criteria bhi to hum jaise logon ne hi banaaye hain (ICD criteria have been made by people like you and me). How can you expect them to fit into the histories of every patient?"He would always ask us to talk to the patient and his/her family members and address the main concern of the patient even if it did not fit into any formal therapy.

This approach has always been with me in more than two decades of clinical practice and has stood me in good stead. We, as students, remember his almost spontaneous rapport with the patients. We also remember his easy availability and ever-smiling face. Every one of his students felt comfortable discussing with him all their problems related to academics and beyond.

Dr Rajeev Gupta will be missed by everyone whose life was touched by him.



#### **Book Published By The IPS North Zone**





The Undergraduate Psychiatry Quiz was organized in two stages, the preliminary round and the final round, in online mode.







A total of 62 teams registered for the Preliminary round which was held on December 6. The top 6 teams qualified for the final round which was held on December 13, 2024.

### Indian Psychiatric Society — North Zone NEWSLETTER



## **Activities of the State Branches**

#### **Jammu and Kashmir Branch**



The 4th Annual National Conference of Addiction Psychiatry Society of India (ADDICON 2024) was organized by the Department of Psychiatry (Advanced Centre for Mental Health and Addiction Medicine) & JK PSYCHIATRIC SOCIETY from 17th to 19th October 2024 at SKIMS Medical College Bemina, Srinagar.

The conference was aimed at addressing the increasing prevalence of drug addiction-related problems in our society. The theme of this year's conference, "Nature to Nurture: preventing Relapse and Maintaining Recovery," is highly relevant, as many patients struggling with addiction face difficulties in maintaining treatment adherence. Factors such as individual behavior, lack of social or family support, clinical challenges related to illness and treatment, and barriers within the health system contribute to non-adherence, ultimately worsening the burden of addiction in our society.

The experts which included distinguished and eminent speakers from across India and abroad shared their expertise and insights, enriching the academic program. The valuable contributions from participating delegates, addressing the various aspects of substance use, helped explore solutions to improve treatment compliance and enhance the successful management of addiction disorders.

An invited symposium was organized in which experts Shri Dinesh Bodh, Narcotics Control Commissioner Govt of India, Dr. Lotika Khajuria, State Drug Controller J&K, and Prof Atul Ambekar regarding regulation psychotropics in India and how the challenges could be tackled to facilitate mental health professionals for smooth running of services in the netter interest of patient care.

The Inauguration ceremony was presided over by Prof Mohd Ashraf Ganie, Director SKIMS Soura & Ex-Officio Secretary to the Govt of J&K with Prof Iffat Hassan Shah, Principal / Dean Govt Medical College Srinagar as Guest of honor. The speakers emphasized the need for research in the area and collaboration by different stakeholders like Health,

## Counselling Services Started At Govt Medical College, Kota

In view of the recent incidents of students of classes 11 and 12 ending their lives while attending the coaching classes at Kota (Rajasthan), the Department of Psychiatry at the Government Medical College, Kota, started a Counselling Centre dedicated to students who might require expert help from mental health professionals. This initiative was conceived and implemented under the guidance of Dr Bharat Singh Shekhawat, Professor and Head of the Department of Psychiatry at the Govt Medical College, Kota.



A huge rainfall greeted the Govt primary school in a remote village of Haryana. It was my first day in my school and I was only 4 years old. The students and head teacher were worried about safety of students and the school records was wet and there was no scope of stoppage of heavy rain and thunderstorms. Suddenly emergency help was sought from Village Panchayat and a rented accommodation was provided to us and we shifted all the resources to this school building. On shifting to new building, the head teacher called my name for reciting National Anthem during prayers meeting at the start of classes. I recited it with full devotion in 52 seconds and it became a daily routine in my school. Whenever any big event used to occur, I was asked to do this noble duty. The whole school students and teachers wished that someday Hon'ble President of India visit our village and I got this noble opportunity and we have group photo with Hon'ble President of India. I use to read stories of Hon'ble president of India and circulate them among students that this dream could be a reality on some day.

Slowly time passed away and I joined an institute of National importance. In between I got selected in various state medical colleges but for fulfilling my dream I remained posted in Central institution. Two times I requested the higher authorities to send invitation to Hon'ble President of India whose photograph was posted at the entrance of my institution but always the authorities replied that it was possible only during convocation. In February I received a message of first convocation on my phone and within seconds I responded to the message. Next day in the meeting a possibility of my reciting National Anthem was communicated. I was little bit not sure as it was a big occasion and so many possibilities could occur. I started rehearsal early in the morning and one first day of rehearsal I put it on the audio system of auditorium. On stage I have seen few students for this noble duty then I realized that it was a difficult chance for me and daily I used to listen the rehearsal. On two occasion I was called on stage as role play for rehearsal and was worried that my name may not be deleted from photo session with President of India. Two three times there was shifting in standing pattern and finally that day came in March 2025. Repeated rehearsal made me realize that this could be possible only with almighty blessings. First time in my life the dream became a reality after 52 years of wait and patience. I considered myself lucky that fortunate day came in my life. I thanked all the competent authorities and all seniors, faculty, students who worked tirelessly for more than ten days to bring reality to this dream. It was a team work which brought that dream as a real day in my life.
